On behalf of the undersigned parent and education organizations, we ask that you **please vote FOR HB 2162** when it comes to the floor. This bill would greatly accelerate the progress Texas has made in recent years to improve the single most important milestone for long-term student success: 3rd Grade Reading.

Only half of all Texas 3rd graders currently read on grade-level, with large gaps remaining for our largest and fast-growing student groups. As illustrated below, before 3rd grade students learn to read, after 3rd grade student read to learn. As a result, student proficiency never surpasses 3rd grade reading levels in later grades and subjects.
