

Texas 2036 Board adopts new legislative agenda for 2025

At its meeting this month in El Paso, the Texas 2036 board of directors approved our legislative agenda for the 89th legislative session, now a little more than two months away.

The agenda highlights five areas of focus for session: water, college and career readiness, health care affordability, the criminal justice department under Sunset review and housing.

Also, Texas 2036 President and CEO **David Leebron** penned an op-ed for El Paso Matters highlighting the city's and Texas 2036's shared determination to tackle the state's biggest challenges.
