\$338B State Budget for 2026-27

The state budget passed the Texas Legislature with \$338 billion on the table for all revenue sources. The budget is currently awaiting the Comptroller's approval before sending to the Governor. Once on the Governor's desk, he has until June 22 to sign off or make line-item vetoes.

It is a challenge to land the plane in any budget cycle – but the investments in SB 1 and HB 500 aim to meet our state's current and impending infrastructure and economic challenges while preserving fiscal flexibility for future legislatures.


